From Miss Meanley	The Bidmas champion this week is Myla J. She has excelled at learning the order of operations and is speedy too. Keep going Myla this is great. 😊

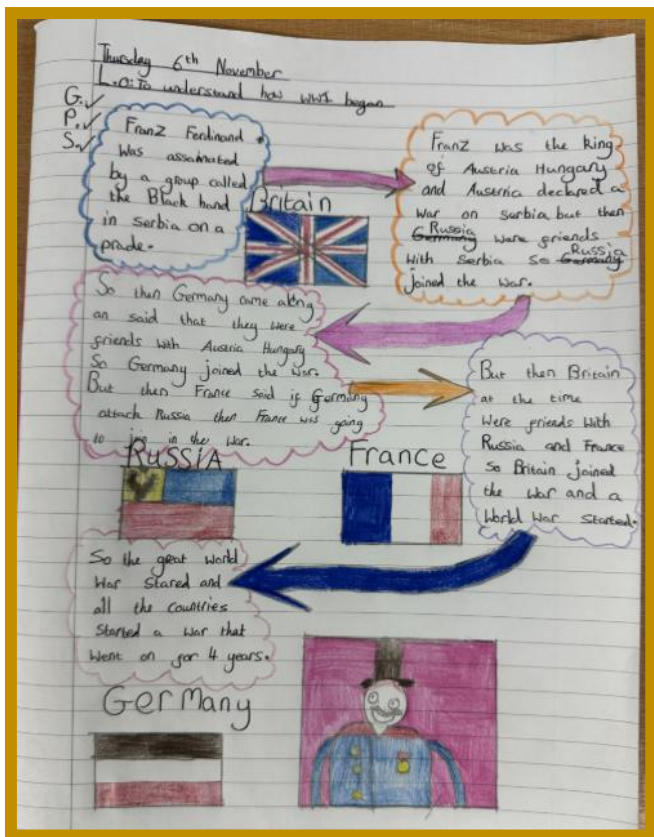
